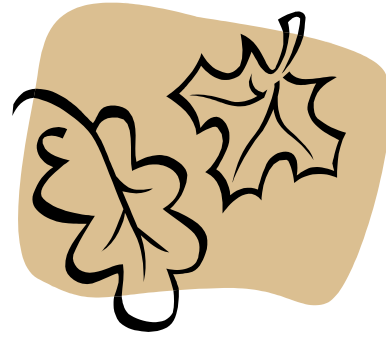

2007 MYSTERY QUILT

The Cleburne Area Quilters Guild will have a Mystery Quilt this year. What is a Mystery Quilt you ask? It is a quilt that you make in steps and do not know what the final top will look like until the final step. I am sure you will like the pattern I have chosen for us. It will be in five parts. I will be giving you a new section in the newsletter and at the meetings for the next five months. This first month's installment is all about the fabric.

You can make this quilt either of two sizes -full size queen, 84" by 84" or you can make it smaller scale at 38" by 38" for a wall hanging. You will be using three fabric types A, B, and C.

A - The main focus fabric should be medium in color value (not very light and not very dark). If you are making the queen size quilt it would be more interesting if you choose a boldly designed print fabric or interesting multi-color batik or hand dye for this fabric. If the quilt is a gift pick a fabric with a theme the person loves -flowers, horses, elephants, ocean, children's toys, outdoor trees and leaves, etc. If your quilt were only black-gray-white this color A would be the gray.

B - B is the Black fabric, i.e. the dark, the contrast fabric. It could be chosen as the deepest color you can find in the A fabric print. It should be deep in color. Contrast is important. The quilt will be much more interesting if this B fabric is made up of several different fabrics to give the quilt a scrappy look. Not just the same dark fabric throughout.

C - This last is the light and bright color. It can be a wild color seen in the A print or anything you think will go and be the eye catcher. Again several fabrics for a scrappy effect will look good.

Now, how much fabric will you need?

Queen Size - Fabric A: 10 fat quarters or 2.5 yards
Fabric B: 12 fat quarters or 3 yards
Fabric C: 4 fat quarters or 1 yard

Wall Hanging - Fabric A: 3 fat quarters or 3/4 yard
Fabric B: 4 fat quarters or 1 yard
Fabric C: 1 fat quarter

I will have my fabric choices at the meeting and will be happy to look at yours to let you know what I think.

Cranberry White Chocolate Cookies

- 2 ½ C All-purpose Flour
- 1 tsp Baking Powder
- ¼ tsp Salt
- 1/8 tsp Baking Soda
- ½ C Butter, softened
- 1 1/3 C Sugar
- 2 lg Eggs
- 1 ½ C White Chocolate Morsels
- 1 6 oz Package Sweetened Dried Cranberries (or Craisins)

• Combine flour and next three ingredients; set aside.

• Beat butter at medium speed with an electric mixer until creamy; gradually add sugar, beating well. Add eggs, one at a time, beating until blended after each addition.

• Add flour mixture to butter mixture gradually, beating at low speed until blended. Stir in white chocolate morsels and cranberries.

• Drop cookie dough by heaping teaspoonfuls onto lightly greased baking sheet (or cover cookie sheet with no-stick Reynolds Wrap). Bake at 350 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes or until lightly browned on bottom. Remove to wire racks to cool completely.
