The Raffle Quilt resulted in \$900 being given to Meals on Wheels, Keene Resource Center and the Johnson County Cemetery Association on behalf of the inmates.

We received a college graduation announcement from one of our earlier scholarship winners. Continuing that tradition we gave a \$500 scholarship to an outstanding young woman who will be entering college this fall.

Our members continue to support the community with their volunteer hours with over 1300 hours logged this year.

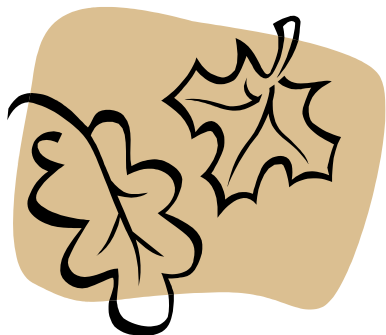
Now it is time to take our eyes off the review mirror and begin looking ahead to see what exciting things are in store for 2007-2008.

Norma's Pasta Salad

1 lb Mostaccioli Noodles (corkscrew)
1 1/2 cups Sugar
1 cup Vinegar
1/2 cup Salad Oil
1 tsp Salt
2 tsp Prepared Mustard
1 tsp Pepper
1 tsp Garlic Powder

Blend together and pour over prepared noodles.

Add:

1 Medium Onion, chopped
1 Cucumber, chopped
2 tsp Dried Parsley Flakes

Marinate for 24 hours then add 1 chopped green pepper and 1 chopped tomato. Refrigerate in air tight container for several days.
